### **Biographical Note**

Ellis Hudson graduated from Decatur High School, followed by Millikin University in 1911. He graduated with a degree in Liberal Arts and wrote a thesis entitled "Biological Sources of the Aesthetic Sense."

Ellis was a member of SAE. During his time at Millikin, he was also active in the following organizations: Philomathean Literary Society (President, 1909), Y.M.C.A. (President, 1911), Glee Club (President 1911), Leader Student Volunteer Band, Inter-Collegiate Debate, Inter-Collegiate Oration, Chairman of Reception Committee, High Honor Society.

A sample of Hudson's writing can be found in the 1911 Millidek on pgs. 72-73. He wrote the history for his class.

### **Scope and Content Note**

The collection is comprised of loose scrapbook pages. Some of the pages have primarily newspaper clippings while others contain photographs, programs, fraternity and glee club memorabilia, and other miscellaneous items.
