BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN NURSING (BSN)

The Bachelor of Science in Nursing program at Millikin University prepares you for a rewarding career in nursing and provides you with a strong foundation for a wide range of professional nursing opportunities. Graduates are well-prepared to enter the nursing field or pursue graduate education leading to careers in teaching, leadership, research, or advanced practice nursing. Qualified students are admitted directly to the nursing major as a freshman and guaranteed a space as long as the student maintains successful progress.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

BSN students are admitted directly to the School of Nursing as freshmen. In order to gain admission, students must:

- » *Have a composite ACT of 20 or equivalent SAT performance*
- » *Have grades that indicate strong performances in high school science and math coursework.*

Successful progression of all coursework during the freshman year of study at Millikin determines conversion to the Nursing major in the sophomore year.

ONLINE RN TO BSN

The Online RN to BSN is for licensed registered nurses from accredited associate degree or diploma nursing programs who want to advance their education to a bachelor's degree. This program provides the best of both worlds — courses are offered online for busy practicing RNs with face-to-face interaction when it matters most. Graduates are prepared to move into nursing leadership positions, continue their education to become advanced practice nurses, or move into other fields such as medicine or business. The program can be completed in one year of full-time study, or a part-time option is also available.

OUR STRENGTHS

The well-respected Millikin University School of Nursing's RN to BSN program has been re-designed as a streamlined and online program for busy registered nurses who want to advance their educational and career options by earning a Bachelor of Science degree in nursing.

The Millikin University School of Nursing recognizes that currently licensed RNs bring rich individual experiences and strengths on which the program builds. Graduates are prepared for professional leadership roles and to advance their education even further.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

- » Offered online except where students will benefit most from hands-on experiences guided by skilled faculty.
- » Program may be completed in one year of full-time study or courses may be taken part-time.
- » Courses meet the BSN educational requirements while supporting the rich knowledge and practice experience of RN students.

SUMMER TERM

- » Nursing Management Through Organizational Leadership

- » The focus on professionalism and organizational leadership prepares graduates to move into leadership positions or continue their education to an advanced practice role.
- » Dedicated Millikin faculty members provide individual attention and create opportunities for students to practice new skills in real health care settings.
- » Students are paired with nursing leaders to plan and implement change projects that improve patient outcomes in health care organizations.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

The Millikin University RN to BSN Program builds on students' prior knowledge and skills. Transcripts from all previous college work are evaluated individually. Students who have earned an Associate degree are given full course and hour transfer credits for courses credited for these degrees up to, in most cases, a maximum of 66 credits. Credit is given for upper division courses in mental health nursing, parent-child nursing, and medical-surgical nursing. These hours are banked until other requirements toward graduation are fulfilled and then the 27 hours are applied to the transcript. Students enrolled in the RN to BSN with a GPA of 3.0 or above may have the opportunity to enroll in up to 3 specific courses in the MSN curriculum. Applicants must maintain unencumbered Registered Nurse licensure in Illinois throughout the program. Prerequisites include:

MASTER'S ENTRY INTO NURSING PRACTICE

Designed for individuals with a non-nursing bachelor's degree, the Master's Entry Into Nursing Practice (MENP) is an accelerated, full-time program of study that will facilitate a smooth transition into the field of professional nursing. Graduates earn a master's degree in nursing and will be eligible to take the National Council Licensure Exam and apply for licensure to become a Registered Nurse.

OUR STRENGTHS

Nursing continues to be one of the fastest growing occupations in the United States. An aging population combined with a swell in the number of nurses retiring means that there is a great deal of opportunity for new professionals to explore exciting clinical specialties and diverse nursing roles.

The Master's Entry into Nursing Practice is a full-time program that begins in July. Students complete 500 clinical and residency hours conducted in the areas of:

- » *Medical-surgical Nursing*
- » *Maternal-child health Nursing*
- » *Pediatric Nursing*
- » *Psychiatric-mental health Nursing*
- » *Public health nursing*

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Students in this program may have a bachelor's degree in any field, making this a great opportunity for those seeking to transition from another career into the field of nursing. The program focuses on essential technical skills while also exploring the dimensions of learning to work effectively with patients, families, and other members of the health care team. Students practice the leadership skills that will help them move into administrative, educational, or advocacy roles. They also acquire expertise in evidence-based practice that employers highly value. Graduates of this program are prepared to pursue a Ph. D or Doctor of Nursing Practice.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- » Submit official transcripts for all graduate and undergraduate institutions attended and demonstrate a minimum grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale
- » Provide scores on Graduate Record Exam (GRE) if undergraduate GPA is less than 3.25

ABOUT THE RESIDENCY

MENP students earn clinical hours and practical experience at several of our partner facilities at multiple sites in Central Illinois. We are proud of the strength of our clinical partnerships and believe these relationships are central to the value and impact of our program.

NURSE EDUCATOR

The Nurse Educator track in the Master of Science in Nursing degree program is designed for registered nurses who hold a Bachelor of Science degree in Nursing and are seeking opportunities to teach in nursing schools, continuing education programs, or staff development programs. Graduates are eligible to take the Certified Nurse Educator exam from the National League for Nursing.

OUR STRENGTHS

Small class sizes and skilled faculty mentors ensure that students are thoroughly engaged in building personal and professional knowledge and skills to advance their nursing careers. Core MSN courses in advanced pathophysiology, advanced health assessment, and advanced pharmacology prepare graduates to continue their education in Doctor of Nursing Practice programs. Specialized education courses groom graduates for high-demand careers in nursing or clinical education settings.

- » *Students can earn an MSN in the Nurse Educator Track in 17 months full-time or take courses part-time*
- » *Experienced faculty mentors offer one-on-one collaboration and support*
- » *Graduates are prepared to teach in clinical or academic settings or continue their own education*

PROFESSIONAL NURSE RESIDENCY

Performance Learning is a hallmark of a Millikin education. MSN Nurse Educator students collaborate with an experienced faculty mentor to design an individual residency to practice what they have learned in MSN classes. Students identify the focus of the residency as either clinical practice or nursing education and collaborate with an assigned preceptor to refine their knowledge and skills in the real world.



DOCTOR OF NURSING PRACTICE (TRACK 1): NURSE ANESTHESIA

The Millikin University and Decatur Memorial Hospital Nurse Anesthesia Program prepares nurses to become Nurse Anesthetists. Students must hold a Bachelor of Science in Nursing and have at least one year of adult critical care nursing experience. Graduates are eligible to take the National Certification Exam offered by the National Board of Certification and Recertification for Nurse Anesthetists.

OUR STRENGTHS

The Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) is a clinical doctorate and this program prepares BSN nurses to move to the highest level of clinical expertise and advanced practice nursing. DNP Track 1 educates experienced critical care RNs with BSN degrees to become highly respected DNP nurse anesthetists. In the second spring semester, students start the DNP Project. This is the first in a sequence of three DNP project courses designed to move students through the process of conducting a clinical change project in their specialty area. The DNP project courses assist students with developing, evaluating, and implementing a clinical project. Students will complete 100 practice hours associated with each project course.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

- » *DNP Track 1 is a competitive 88 credit, 36 month, full-time course of study*
- » *Small cohorts and engagement with upperclassmen and anesthesia experts provide a foundation of support in this rigorous program*
- » *Students receive personalized attention from both a Millikin academic advisor and a DMH clinical advisor from the first day of orientation*
- » *Multiple regional clinical affiliates ensure excellent anesthesia practice experiences to meet or exceed national requirements*
- » *Close proximity and collaboration between Millikin University and the clinical home at DMH allows theory and clinical to be integrated seamlessly across the curriculum*

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- » Graduation from an accredited BSN program with a GPA over 3.0 on a 4.0 scale
- » Graduate Record Exam (GRE) if GPA is less than 3.0
- » Evidence of an unencumbered/unrestricted RN license in the State of Illinois or be eligible to obtain upon admission
- » At least one year of Adult Critical care nursing experience. Current experience is strongly preferred
- » Undergraduate grade of C or better in: nursing research, health assessment, organic chemistry, and introductory statistics
- » Must provide evidence of ACLS, BCLS, PALS, and CCRN certification
- » Grade of C or better in a graduate level statistics course
- » Three letters of recommendation, a personal statement and completion of a clinical skills checklist (see website for details)

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DNP COMPLETION FOR MSN-PREPARED ADVANCED PRACTICE NURSES

DNP Track 2 is a clinical doctorate program specifically designed for currently licensed Advanced Practice Nurses who are Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetists, Certified Nurse Midwives, Nurse Practitioners, or Clinical Nurse Specialists that want to increase their knowledge and skills to the highest level of clinical nursing practice. The curriculum is offered in a part-time format, with courses delivered online.

OUR STRENGTHS

The Doctor of Nursing Practice Track 2 is delivered online.

In the second spring semester, students start the DNP Project. This is the first in a sequence of three DNP project courses designed to move students through the process of conducting a clinical change project in their specialty area.

The DNP project courses assist students with developing, evaluating, and implementing a clinical project. Students will complete 100 practice hours associated with each project course.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- » Official transcripts from all graduate and undergraduate institutions attended and demonstrate a minimum graduate grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale
- » Evidence of MSN core courses, including a graduate-level statistics and Health Care Policy and Economics course prior to enrollment or by the end of the first semester of DNP coursework
- » Possess an unencumbered/unrestricted license as an Advanced Practice Registered Nurse in Illinois
- » Evidence of advanced practice national certification (Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetists, Certified Nurse Midwives, Nurse Practitioners or Clinical Nurse Specialists)
- » Three written recommendations as described on the application form:
 - *Individuals who can speak to the applicant's integrity, clinical nursing performance, and potential for success in a doctoral program*
 - *At least one recommendation must be from a direct supervisor/co-practitioner and/or former nursing instructor*
- » Submit a written statement (see application for details)
- » Submit a current résumé or curriculum vita that demonstrates advanced nursing practice experience and continuing education since licensure

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

The Curriculum of Track 2 of the Doctor of Nursing Practice degree program focuses on evidence-based practice, public policy advocacy, improving safety and organizational effectiveness, health informatics, population health, financial and business management, and advanced specialty practice.

HOUSING
