Special Education Endorsement Promotion

Coursework will cover the following topics in Special Education:

Identifying children with special needs & writing Individual Education Plans Understanding the psychological & practical impacts a disability can have on an <u>individual or family</u> Developing & implementing effective strategies for educating individuals with special needs Learning how to apply knowledge of disabilities in an educational setting

Teachers can complete the endorsement and become licensed in special education (LBS1) by taking the state-required four courses at Millikin's School of Education (ED 115, ED215, ED 220, ED 408).

- Each course costs \$1,497 (\$499/credit).
- Limited \$500-\$1,000 scholarships are available.
- To obtain the endorsement, teachers must also pass the Special Education Content Test #155.
- COVID-19 protocols may change the course delivery method for hybrid and in-person courses.
- Teachers must receive a grade of C- or better in each class.
- Teachers must complete the FAFSA to determine loan eligibility.
- Most practicing teachers will have completed ED 115 (or an articulated transfer class) in their undergraduate program. Therefore, they will only need to complete the remaining three courses for the Special Education Endorsement. Millikin's Registrar's Office determines course articulations.
