Biographical Note

Betty Joyce Eikenberry of Flora, Indiana, was a student of the Music Conservatory (1924-1926) and a member of Sigma Alpha Iota. She taught music for two years at Roosevelt Junior High School. She later became the supervisor of music in Decatur High School. She married Yale graduate Frederick J. Bogardus in 1934.

Scope and Content Note

Betty Joyce Eikenberry (or Betty Jo) lived in Aston while at Millikin, and the collection includes a pamphlet about Aston, as well as its Constitution and By-laws. The photos of campus are on pages dated June 1920, before she was a student, and are either taken from above, or labeled photos of campus buildings (perhaps printed by the University as promotional material?). Ephemera includes a cigarette and items relating to a homecoming football game and dance, a 1926 Kappa Delta Chi dance, a Chinese tea, the 1926 Quarter centennial exercises, the induction of president Penney, music programs for Conservatory events at the Lincoln Square Theatre, a 1924 program for Sousa and His Band, and glee club events.
