Biographical Note

Clarence L. Miller’s first term as president came in August of 1944. President Hessler had died while Miller was serving as dean of the university. Clarence was quickly appointed acting president. Miller worked diligently to accommodate incoming WWII veterans onto campus. Miller was replaced as president by Dr. J. Walter Malone on October 21, 1945. Miller would serve as acting president again for 18 months, from 1956-1957 due to the health-related resignation of President Malone. Following Miller’s second term as president, Dr. Paul McKay was appointed Millikin University president. It was under McKay that Miller served as vice president and dean of the faculty. Dr. Miller retired from Millikin in June of 1962.

Scope and Content Note

This collection focuses on C. L. Miller’s first term as Millikin President. It especially focuses on the hiring of prospective faculty from this time.
