### **Biographical Note**

Before becoming president of Millikin University, Dr. Curtis L. McCray was the president of California State University at Long Beach. He graduated from Knox College with a degree in psychology, received a Woodrow Wilson Fellowship for graduate study in psychology at the University of Pennsylvania, and earned a Ph.D in English from the University of Nebraska. McCray accomplished much during his five-year presidency from 1993 to 1998, including the creation of the Millikin Institute, the opening of the Oakland Hall dormitory and The Woods residential complex, the construction of Pilling Chapel, an upgrade of track and field facilities, and the start of major renovations and an addition to the School of Music. Additionally, McCray started working with the Decatur Park District to create a joint use facility, which would later be called the Decatur Indoor Sports Center (DISC). McCray left Millikin to become president of National-Louis University in Evanston, Illinois, this location being closer to his children.

### Scope and Content Note

This collection primarily focuses on McCray's time as Millikin president. Very little personal information is present within this collection.
