NOTES:

- * ED370 can be taken either Spring 1 or Spring 2, but Spring 1 is recommended. If you have a job in a school district (e.g., TA; paraprofessional), talk to your academic advisor and/or the ED370 professor to see if you can use your district for your placement.
- ED306 and ED337 could be interchanged between semester 3 and semester 4 depending on staffing. Consult the course offerings and your academic advisor to assure you take these courses when offered.
- FLEX students might need to take additional coursework to fulfill degree requirements. Talk to your academic advisor shortly after your transcripts are on record in the Registrar's Office to develop your individualized course plan.
- Depending on transfer credit articulation, you may not need to take all educated courses listed. Talk to your academic advisor shortly after transcripts are on record in the Registrar's Office to develop your individualized course plan.
- Evening/online courses listed in each semester are typically offered in an evening/online format only during the term listed above (e.g., the evening/online ED209 is only offered in **Spring semesters**). If you do not take a course (or pass a course) in the semester specified, the earliest you might be able to take (or retake) the course would be one year later.

- Consult the licensure review form for ELED to see these require courses laid out in checklist format (the licensure review form is what's used to verify that you're eligible for licensure upon finishing student teaching). Email licensure officer for access to this sheet.
- Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) licensure changes supersede the catalog year of Millikin University's degree/licensure/endorsement programs.
- * Courses must be passed with a grade of C- or higher to fulfill licensure requirements. Student Teaching (ED476) must be passed with a grade of B- or higher, as per licensure requirements.**
