Biographical Note

Jesse Hayes White served as Millikin University president from 1930-1934. He was a graduate of Indiana University and received his Ph.D. from Clark University. He was noted as an author and orator and was chair of the psychology department at the University of Pittsburgh. Construction of Millikin's Gorin Library Building happened during his period as president. Also during his tenure, Millikin received recognition by the University of Illinois, continuing accreditation by the North Central Association, and accreditation by the National Association of Schools of Music (NASM) in 1934. White's resigned as Millikin president effective June 18, 1934.

Scope and Content Note

This collection features a selection of handwritten and typed addresses from president White. Correspondence contained within this collection includes communications between White during his time as president and other organizations, departments, and universities.
