#### **Biographical Note**

Klondis T. Pirtle was born in Sparta, Illinois. He started attending Millikin in 1957. During his time at Millikin, Pirtle was active in the school's choir, and the fraternities of Delta Sigma Phi and Phi Chi Alpha. Pirtle also served as sophomore and senior class President, and as the business manager of the Millidek. Pirtle graduated from Millikin in 1961 with a Bachelor of Science Degree from the School of Business and Industry. Pirtle married fellow Millikin graduate, Carol Frede, in June of 1961. He then returned to Sparta where he worked his father at his family's business; Lynn Furniture Company. He later took over the role of President of the company.

#### **Scope and Content Note**

This collection consists mostly of ephemera from the Delta Sigma Phi fraternity, and other Greek organization-sponsored events and dances. Additionally, there are a fair number of programs from Millikin-sponsored events (Homecoming, commencements, student handbooks, and Bulletins). There is very little personal information on Pirtle in this collection.
