Biographical Note

According to the Millikin University Bulletin, William Robert Ross, of Palmyra, was a freshman student at Millikin University in 1918-1919. Records of his attendance after 1919 are difficult to obtain. Refer to the letter that he wrote in 1918 in his composition book for more information.

Scope and Content Note

The Ross Collection primarily consists of William Ross' writing and programs from various Millikin and Decatur events. Other items, such as promotional posters for coming events, are included as well, although they are not as prevalent. Nearly all of the collection is dated 1919.
