Biographical Note

Wilma Lux is a native of Milmine, Illinois, daughter of alumna Clara Lefever (class of 1914). While a student at Millikin, Lux was the co-editor of the Decaturian and was an assistant in Gorin Library. She was active in Phi Mu Theta, the Women's Athletic Association, and the Conant Literary Society. She graduated from Millikin in 1940, then received her Master's Degree from the University of Chicago. From 1946-1948, Lux returned to the area and taught Political Science and History at Millikin. From 1953-55, Lux was a Fulbright teacher in England. She later would spend two years in Morocco, where she helped establish an English language library under the sponsorship of the U.S. government. She returned to the states, and studied administration at Eastern Illinois University; it was at EIU that she became the first woman of the university to receive the Specialist in Education Degree. Lux would go on to become one of the first Program Planners for the Decatur-Macon County Economic Opportunity Corp. in the 1960s. In the 1980s, Lux would occasionally write for The Herald and Review.

Scope and Content Note

This collection consist miscellaneous papers and ephemera from Wilma Lux's time at Millikin, both as a student and later as a professor. There is no personal information on Lux within this collection.
